Expanded Learning Opportunities: Expanded learning opportunities to address learning loss/loss of instructional time for underserved students who have been disproportionately impacted by the pandemic will include literacy, science, technology, engineering, mathematics, health and recreation and social and emotional learning.

Educational Programming in Core areas: Educational opportunities will include math, reading and STEM.

Current Supports: School Success, 31n Therapist, Thunder Bay Community Health Therapist, Restorative Practice Staff, Title 1 Reading and Math (K-5), Title 1 Math (6-8), STARS-Tier 2 Reading, Imagine Math-Tier 2, Special Education-Tier 3

Metrics used to Select Students: We will consider students with learning loss in the following categories: Low income, students with disabilities, racial and ethnic minorities, homeless students, students who failed third grade reading test or core areas, truant students, and students recommended by their teacher.

Metrics used to evaluate Program: NWEA (K-8) spring & fall, Informal Decoding Inventory (IDI) (K-8) testing cycle, Imagine Math(K-8) pre and post test, Course Completion (grades 6-12), recommendations to advance student to next grade level.

Evidenced-based Activities Implemented: IXL Reading & Math (K-12), Differentiated Reading Instruction (DRI) (K-5), Imagine Math (K-8), Add+Vantage Math Recovery (AVMR) (K-3), Edgenuity Core Subjects (6-12). STEM Challenge Activities, and group work with Thunder Bay Community Health Services. The above will be provided by a Teacher and Paraprofessional with the support of National Honor Society students.

Parent/Family Support: Information will be mailed to parents regarding IXL Reading and Math on-line support for grades K-8. Progress reports, IXL reports and current grades will be sent home to parents. Parents will also be informed of missing assignments.

Tracking student performance and engagement in distance learning: N/A, all learning will be on site.

Other: The Learning Loss Plan will be presented to the Board of Education on October 17, 2023. A link to the Learning Loss Plan will be posted on the Atlanta Community Schools website.

Data for participating students will be reviewed at each testing cycle and the end of the school year to determine if academic growth has been achieved.
