Safety Protocol for Inside Events

We will be installing locked gates by the elementary gym that will prevent access to the building during inside events. The doors by the bathrooms in the picture hallway will be locked during events in the high school gym for the same purpose. This is another step in keeping our building a safe learning environment for our staff and students.

Please let us know if you need help getting these items. We have plenty of resources to make sure everyone has what they need.

School Safety Update

The week of October 17-21, 2022 was School and School Bus Safety Week. Atlanta staff and students take safety on the school bus and on school grounds very seriously. We have initiated a School Safety Team and have planned training for staff and assemblies for students addressing safety. Our Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) is updated monthly based on new initiatives and practices. We are currently working with companies to implement a School Safety Assessment and Critical Incident Mapping. Both of these are paid for out of grants from the Michigan Department of Education (MDE). All of our classrooms have "Go Kits", which are backpacks and buckets of supplies they may need in the event that an incident may happen. We are in the process of applying for a grant that would partially fund a School Resource Officer (SRO). We hope to have a SRO in place by the 2023-2024 school year. We will continue to provide updates to students, staff, families and the community through this newsletter, monthly staff memos, and student assemblies. Please feel free to reach out if you have any questions or concerns.

Life Skills Classes

Randy Mullard, with Catholic Human Services, has been meeting with our 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th grade classes providing some life skills instruction. Classes have been going very well and enjoyed by all students. He meets with each class once a week for eight (8) weeks and covers subjects like self-image, decision making, communication, peer pressure, bullying, etc.

In addition to the life skills curriculum, each class is working on a project. They have identified what they believe to be an issue within their grade (bullying, vaping, etc.) and they are researching why they believe it's an issue and possible solutions that might assist in resolving the issue. Each class is responsible for creating and presenting their projects at the end of the eight week class schedule.


Huskie Hoops & Wrestling

We are extremely happy to be able to bring back the MSU Extension Nutrition program. Danielle Jirasek has been working with our 3rd and 8th grade classes on healthy eating.
